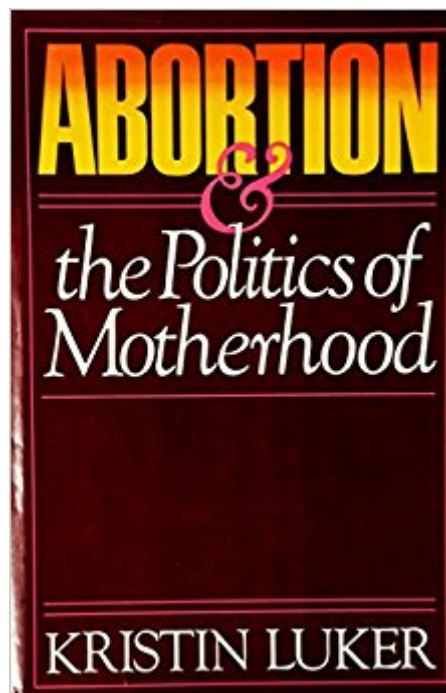




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# Abortion And The Politics Of Motherhood (California Series On Social Choice And Political Economy)
