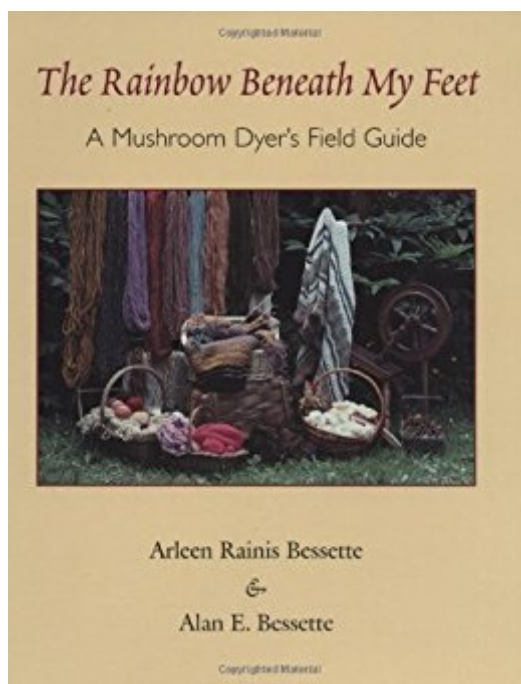

My only criticism is that the authors decided not to mention common names for the mushrooms; but they're a lot easier to memorize than Latin names unless you're at least a serious-minded amateur botanist! Yes, I agree that they are more accurate and common names are often misapplied but would it hurt to mention them? After all, this book isn't designed for scientists but for lay craftspeople; and it's not about eating the specimens but making a dyebath with them. I find myself studying the book with high interest but the names of the mushrooms are completely gone from my head within an hour or so of putting the book down because I am not educated in Latin and the italicized words are gibberish to me. I'll have to really apply myself to learn them and, frankly, I struggle to find time for natural dying as it is. So that decision was counter-productive in my opinion, especially as the pictures are so good. How many of us know all the Latin names for the flowers we grow in our gardens?! The decision might have made a difference between my actually being able to make full use of this book and so it also cost them one star.

I would have liked a bit more information on the parts of the country/world where specific mushrooms are found. I can hardly wait until spring in New England brings the opportunity to experiment with these mushrooms.

The vast majority of the species in this book are found only on the east coast. Makes it very disappointing to this west coast resident. Unfortunately it is the only book I could find of its type. I will be using it as a reference for my own mushroom dying experiments. One of my more nit-picky complaints is that it doesn't mention whether the particular mushroom is mycorrhizal or not. This is important to me because I want to grow the dye mushrooms, and you can't do that with mycorrhizal ones. So, it's okay, a little disappointing, but okay.

I have bought and used this book for many years. It is a great book for reference or for fun. You will be amazed at the colors you can obtain from mushrooms. I have been dyeing with mushrooms for over 25 years, and this book just added more information for my passion. A good addition to my stable of books used for learning and teaching about natural dyes.

You have to go to different sections of the book to put together name, color and dye it produces. I ended up jotting down my own notes.

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
