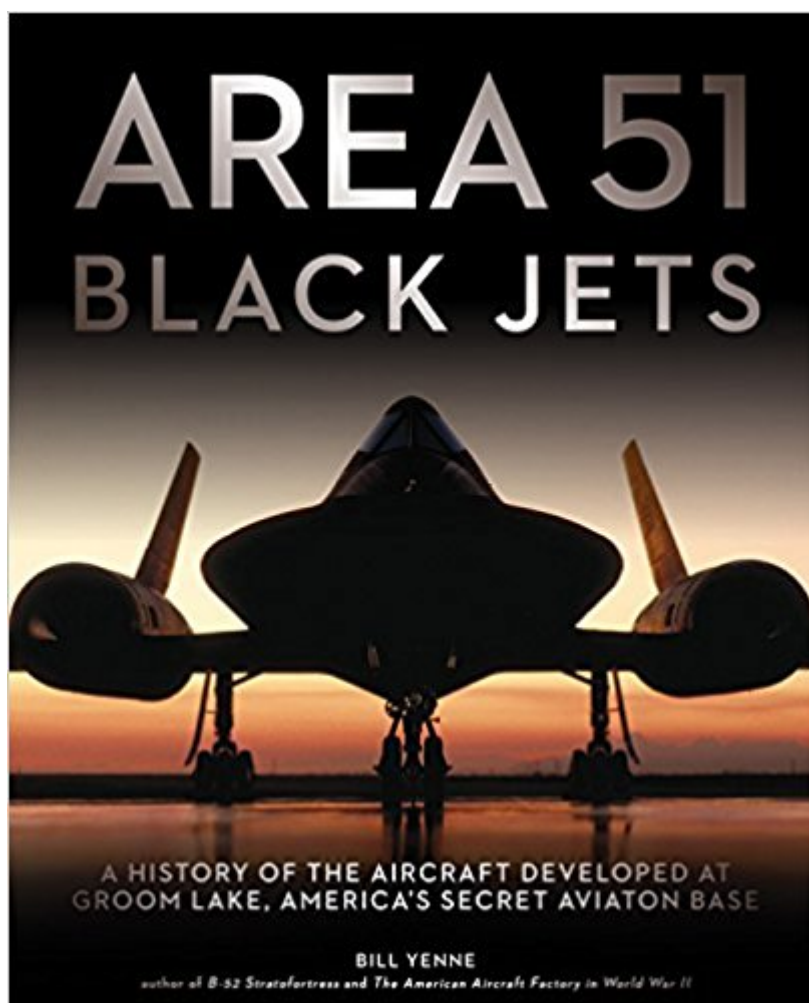

Area 51 - Black Jets: A History Of The Aircraft Developed At Groom Lake, America's Secret Aviation Base



Synopsis

Area 51's most important military aviation developments are profiled in an illustrated format. When most of us think of Area 51, we think of aliens, UFOs, and controversial government cover-ups. It's easy to forget that, since the mid-1950s, the United States' famed extension of Edwards Air Force Base has served as a top-secret CIA testing ground for many of the most groundbreaking advancements in American military aviation technology. In *Area 51 - Black Jets*, author and military historian Bill Yenne offers the first fully illustrated chronology of Area 51's most famous aircraft projects, including Lockheed's U-2 "Dragon Lady" and SR-71 "Blackbird" reconnaissance planes, drones ranging from the early Lockheed D-21 to the modern-day General Atomics MQ-1 Predator, and the famous F-117 Nighthawk stealth fighter produced by the Have Blue program during the 1970s. Each project is given its own fascinating chapter illuminating the aircraft's development at this famed location. But beyond the aircraft themselves, *Area 51 - Black Jets* also covers a handful of the many classified experimental programs carried out at Area 51 over the years, such as Have Doughnut, Have Ferry, and Have Drill - secret undertakings that successfully reverse-engineered such enemy aircraft as the Russian MiG during the Cold War. Presented in beautiful hardcover format and illustrated with historic color and black-and-white photographs, diagrams, and maps, this book reveals Area 51 for what it truly is: a clandestine area for the United States' most cutting-edge technological innovators in military aviation.

Bill Yenne is the author of more than three dozen nonfiction books on historical topics. His books on aviation and military history have included Area 51 Black Jets--which T. D. Barmes, formerly with NASA High Range and Area 51 Special Projects, described as "not a book that the reader will lay down and not finish. It holds one's interest from front to back." Yenne has also contributed to encyclopedias of World War I and World War II and has been featured in several documentaries which have aired on the History Channel, the National Geographic Channel, the Smithsonian Channel, and ARD German Television. The Wall Street Journal notes that Yenne writes "with a cinematic vividness." Yenne has also authored ten novels and has penned several books on beer and brewing history, including Beer: The Ultimate World Tour.

With all of the material that is available today about the "black jets" it seems that much of what Bill and his editors have put together repeats much of the data and the photos that have been seen before. The things that interested me the most were the photos and data he brings out about the location, geography and use of the adjacent sites for things of a nuclear nature. Also, much of the mapping etc., has only been available from more unique sources and Bill has put them all together in one place. The final chapters on some "speculative" items was interesting, and I think seemed to have been written with a little "tongue in cheek" approach. All in all a good buy with much to interest the "black jet" person, but not the "black jet" specialist.

Actually, this book is only a summary of the black airplanes tested at the Groom Lake (and

surrounding areas) north of Las Vegas. So the B2 bomber is acknowledged but not discussed (as it was not tested at that location). Still, the book talked about many planes I had heard something about as well as some that I had not known about. The book also gives some history on the myths behind Area 51. The book does not go into a lot of technical details; so it was a fairly easy read. The book's coverage of black jets seemed quite complete; though in such a secrecy-shrouded environment, who can know for sure? There are also a number of photos. Photos (and maps) don't show up well on the Kindle's e-ink reader (so I had to use the Kindle app to view them on my PC). Also, when I finished reading the book, my Kindle indicated the book was 75% read (as reference materials were the final 25% of the book). Note: As I'd already read Ben Rich's book (Skunk Works), there was some information overlap. I felt Rich's book, being written from a personal viewpoint, was a more interesting read. But both books have something of value for the reader.

Area 51 is often feted by UFO gurus as a secret site for the US government's efforts to reverse-engineer UFO spaceships and research into extraterrestrials. In reality, the most top-secret military base built in the United States has been a testing ground for some American spyplanes and X-planes with potential military applications. Renowned writer Bill Yenne chronicles the history of Area 51 and all the planes that have been flown at the base since the 1950s, from the U-2 Dragon Lady to the Bird of Prey and RQ-170. He also devotes one chapter of this book to MiG fighters that were acquired by the US for evaluation testing at Area 51, and Yenne also discusses the mythical Aurora spyplane and Black Manta tactical spyplane, whose existence was postulated based on anecdotal sightings. For anyone interesting in secret US military aircraft, Area 51: Black Jets is a valuable guide.

I got the Kindle version. Bill's book is about as thorough as you can expect from a site that is the home of exclusively Special Access programs, and has plenty of imagery one wouldn't expect, including photos on the actual flightline there. He makes sure not to wander too far into the Woo, but does briefly address some rumored aircraft like the Aurora.

Okay compendium / summary of the subject. Suitable for folks new to the subject matter. Does not add anything new from what has been available on the web and elsewhere for some years. Basically a small-scale over-priced coffee table book. Nice format & photos but with rehashed info

as textual content. Old stories retold.

Having lived in Las Vegas for over 25 years, I've noted that most of the local and even national and international news stories center around the publicity seeking jerks with their theories of alien beings. These are, as the author pointed out very politely, totally bogus, but are much to the delight of the people in charge of the critical defense programs that do exist. Yenne has taken a ton of now unclassified data and pieced together an interesting story of aerospace history. A great read.

In the 1990's I worked for Raytheon at the DOE's nuclear energy test site in the mountain range north of Las Vegas, NV. We had a nuclear device assembly facility at Area 93, adjacent to Area 51. While we did see U-2's and other aircraft coming and going, all other activities at Area 51 were hidden by the desert mountains. Bill Yenne's book filled in many blank spots from that era of time that I could only guess about. I found the book accurate, interesting, and easy reading.WRM
