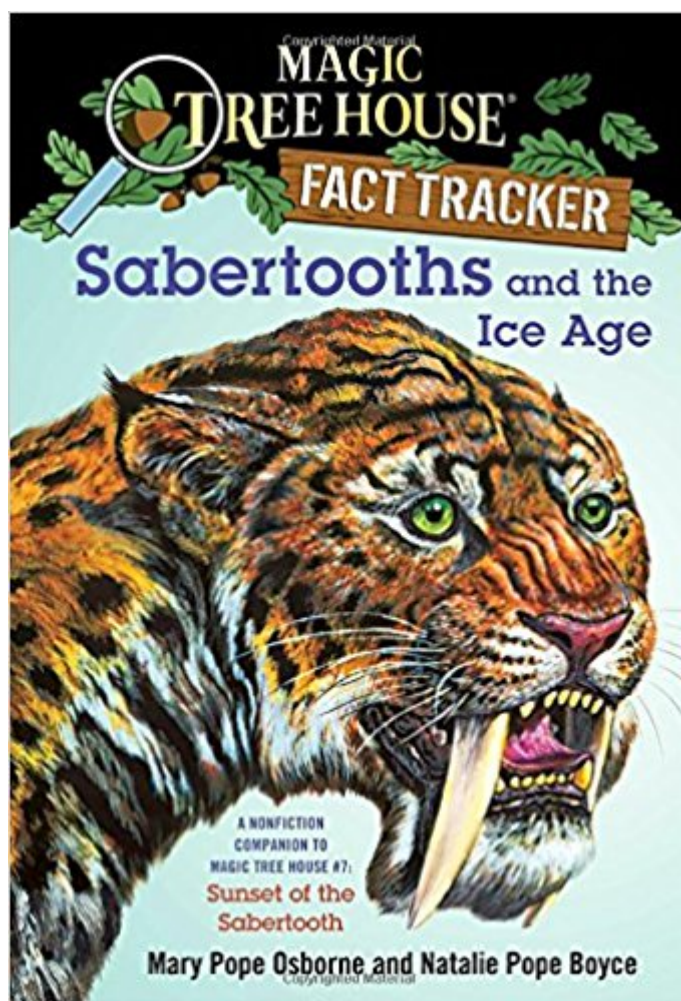

We love all the research guides for MTH. They are written at a higher Lexile level than the stories but it makes them fun to read together.
