

Sketches for two or more performers make up the final pages. The routines are usually comic, but there is a smattering of the tragic and frightening. This is the mime book for someone who learns by seeing and doing. Through 45 detailed scripts, the future mime learns the vocabulary and scope of the art. From a child eating ice cream to a sports fan, the reader sees examples of mime in the mind's eye. There is almost no theory in this book, just good, practical scripts for one, two, or more actors.

I teach a mime class. I needed scenes for my students to do. This hits the spot. This book has saved me time from creating my own stuff.

It is better to invent your own routines, there is no technique, no history of mime, not much of value.
