

I got the Kindle version of this math book. As for the Kindle version, it reads well on the kindle app on my phone, tablet, and the PC app on the laptop and desktop. Each page is shown in full and there are no breaks in the pages.I got this textbook to help aid in my homeschool math instruction.

The book has nine chapters and an answer key. Each chapter varies with six to ten lessons as well as a chapter test at the end of each chapter. There are also chapter reviews for chapters 1-4 and 1-9. As far as content goes each chapter focuses on a concept and each lesson in the chapter builds on the one concept and then there is a chapter test. Each lesson has up to two examples and explanations for each lesson, and depending on the lesson and concept there are between 6 to 14 practice questions for numbers only problems and about 2 to 6 practice questions for word problems and or more logical thinking questions. Overall this is a good textbook for practicing apt concepts for the grade level. I sometimes go by the examples given in the book if it is an easier concept, but most of the time I follow the book and take from its examples and further instruct my boys on a concept. I often provide extra time and practice problems if the concept is harder or needs more time to focus on. This book has helped to guide my math instruction to my boys and I have also purchased the Grade 3 book as well since this book has proven successful for our homeschool needs so far.

If you are homeschooling lightly, or unschooling, and want a light textbook. This is a good option. It's colorful, and it's not distracting. I will be using this set of books in the future for what I plan on getting into with kids later. And it helped me get caught up on a lot of missing math. Or rather new math ideas that I didn't get do to a lot of things. The short story, I enjoyed all the way up to 8.

I used some of the problems for my grandson. I can't explain some of the ways they go about setting up the system to solve problems, so I adapt to what I do know. He can do the actual problems as given. Unless you know "Common Core", I don't recommend it.

This workbook was bought for my homeschooled child, compared to other math books set for 2nd grade it is the same. Problems were what I expected for this grade. If your grade can do two number problems, can tell time and count money, then a higher grade book is needed. I thought about returning because it was not what I needed, but I have a younger child that can use it.

As a teacher, I was expecting more in the way of children being able to truly practice skills that are challenging. For example, the very few pages on two digit addition and subtraction were far too short for a child to fully understand and apply these concepts if he/she is just learning them, or is struggling and needs additional practice. Not much help in the classroom!

Used this as a ten week summer resource since I pulled my daughter late in the year and really wanted to see where she stood academically. She learned a few things, it gave her an extra boost to start 3rd grade and it gave me the confidence to continue on. Please note this is based on a 10 week structure. Quick, but not extremely in depth.
