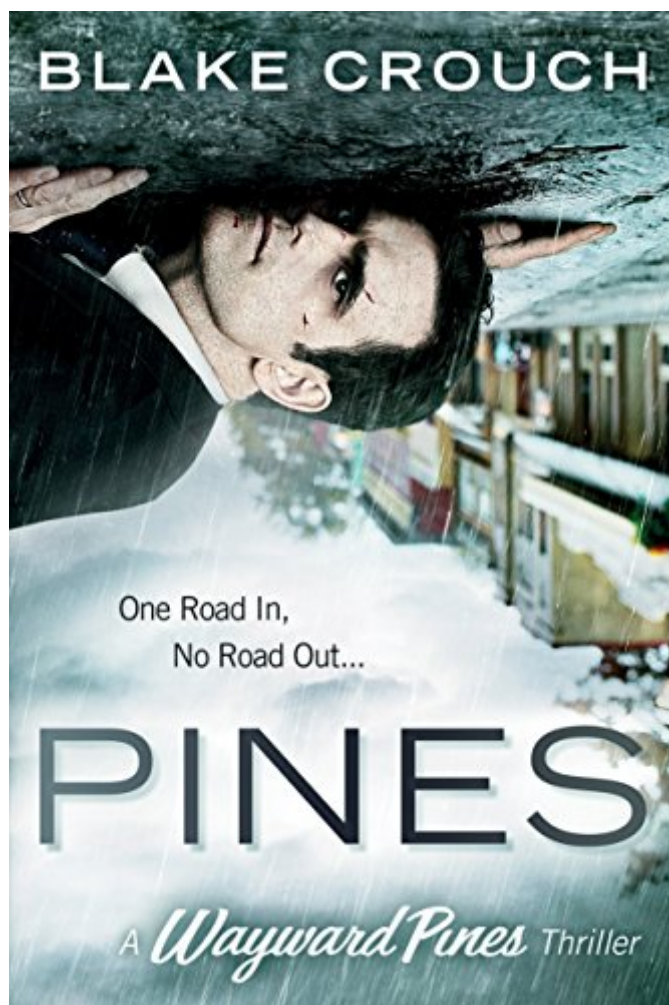


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Pines (The Wayward Pines Trilogy, Book 1)

I am not sure where to begin. I started watching the tv show Wayward Pines in 2015. And I found it great and mysterious. Shortly before the 2nd season started, i was told the tv show was based on the book, so i did a bit of research, and discovered that there were three books in the series. So what did i do??? That's right, i went and bought all three books, and started reading right away. From here some might say i am having a problem because i am unable to put the book/series down. I am normally a slow reader, but in this case i finished the whole series in 4 days which is not like me. At this point, i really hope that Blake Crouch writes a book 4 at the very least.

I just continued reading to get to the conclusion and thought I'd be more engaged in the book but I just wasn't. The main character just wanders around town expecting people to just go along with what he wants, he's whiny & demanding; however, in flashbacks, the author makes the character seem so strong & capable of anything. throughout the book. Also, there is a lot of "filler" which does nothing to add to the novel, I kept flipping up to check my progress & felt like I'd never finish.
