




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# The Scene Book: A Primer For The Fiction Writer

This is the first utility book on fiction writing I've read that truly delves into the art and science of writing a scene. It provides an excellent discussion of the elements of a successful scene, particularly its "beats" necessary to drive the scene so that the scene itself can drive the story.
