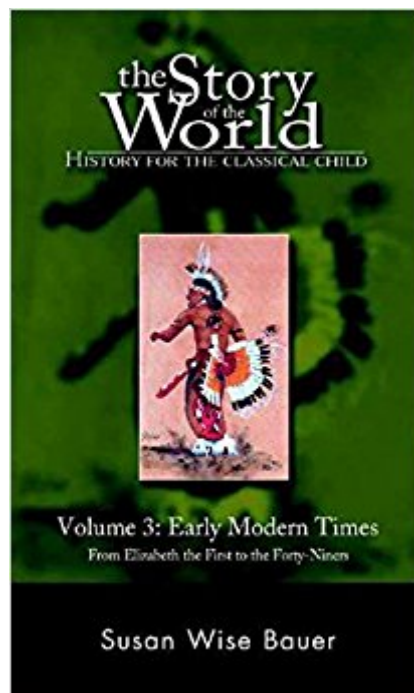

W. Norton) and the *Story of the World* series (Well-Trained Mind Press). She has a Ph.D. in American Studies from the College of William & Mary in Virginia, as well as an M.A. in seventeenth-century literature and a Master of Divinity in Ancient Near Eastern Languages and Literature. For fifteen years, she taught literature and composition at the College of William and Mary.[^] She lives in Virginia.

My kids love *The Story of the World*. History has gone from boring facts in their mind to a complex and interwoven story that they are constantly referring back to in other areas of their life.

I am a teacher, and I originally bought this to help me teach my fourth, fifth, and sixth graders. However, I now love to read it to my son. The book is a really easy and enjoyable read. I think that it is excellent to have for a kid who loves history, is struggling in history, or just needs encouragement for learning history.

This history series is homeschooler friendly. Balanced--Not from a Christian or anti-Christian perspective. Kids enjoy it as much as they enjoy any school book. I have learned a thing or two also. Lot of info for the money. You don't need to supplement a ton, especially if you buy the activity book, but, it's fun to get things out of the library or go online to flesh it out a bit, and to get color photos. A read aloud for the whole family for sure.

I have been using these books for years. These deliver the historical information in a way that makes it seem more like reading a story than memorizing dates. I was never one much for History, but this series is great. The companion Student Activity book is wonderful too and gives all sorts of options/crafts to do to really help the child learn in a hands on kind of way.
