Gr 9 Up  •A groundbreaking Latina educator, TV personality, and award-winning children's book author shares a poignantly written memoir about growing up in the South Bronx. Manzano, known to many as Maria from Sesame Street, relates events from her youth with candor and childlike curiosity as she tries to find her place within her Puerto Rican family and the dominant white culture. Beginning with fragments from when she was a toddler and ending with her

life-changing audition for Sesame Street, the book includes vignettes that offer glimpses of a singular coming of age that will resonate with many young people, regardless of socioeconomic background or culture. Moving from a cockroach-infested apartment to one riddled with rats was a common occurrence, and her father's violent outbursts continually threatened the safety of the family. Still, music, laughter, food, a network of cousins and friends, and a love of performance shone a light in Sonia's life, and glimmers of the beloved character she made iconic peek through the trials of an impoverished but warm upbringing. Phrases in Spanish and gritty details of urban life in 1960s New York City add authenticity to this work. Nuanced depictions of racism and sexism will be eye-opening for some readers and all-too-familiar for others. The author shows great restraint, never tinging memories with adult rationalizations or nostalgia, but infuses each episode with age-appropriate language and forthrightness. Lyrical passages, such as one about her first trip to Puerto Rico, are filled with vivid imagery, and the scenes touching upon her burgeoning sexual awakening ring true with sensitivity and subtlety. **VERDICT** As timeless as Esmeralda Santiago's *When I Was a Puerto Rican* (Vintage, 1994) and Jacqueline Woodson's *Brown Girl Dreaming* (Penguin, 2014), this memoir will strike a chord with teens and adults alike. I grew up with Maria from Sesame Street being one of my earliest, closest, most trusted Puerto Rican role models so of course I was intrigued to read about her. It's a bit of a culture shock to go from Sesame Street to Sonia Manzano's real life growing up in the Bronx with an abusive father, but ultimately it makes me respect the actress even more. Sonia's memories of her thoughts and feelings growing up put you right in the picture and--darn it--I wish the book were longer. I don't want to stop reading.

Personally, this book was like going home. She describes it exactly as it was. Conflicts and fights within the family and yet moments of love and forgiveness. Growing up in New York gave some of us the opportunity to enjoy museums, summer camps, Broadway shows, in other words culture that other impoverished children are not afforded in this country. These opportunities opened our eyes to the outside world of the ghettos inspite of the prejudices that forced us into them. Even as a child I could see that there was a chance to live differently with education. From one Boricua to another, thank you for taking me back.

snippets of her childhood and into the very beginnings of her adulthood. I can relate to a lot of what she dealt with, her struggle and questioning of things.

It's filled with funny, tragic and surreal moments, and provides not only a compelling look at how she got to Sesame Street but a vivid portrait of South Bronx life in the 50s and 60s as well. Really awesome...
