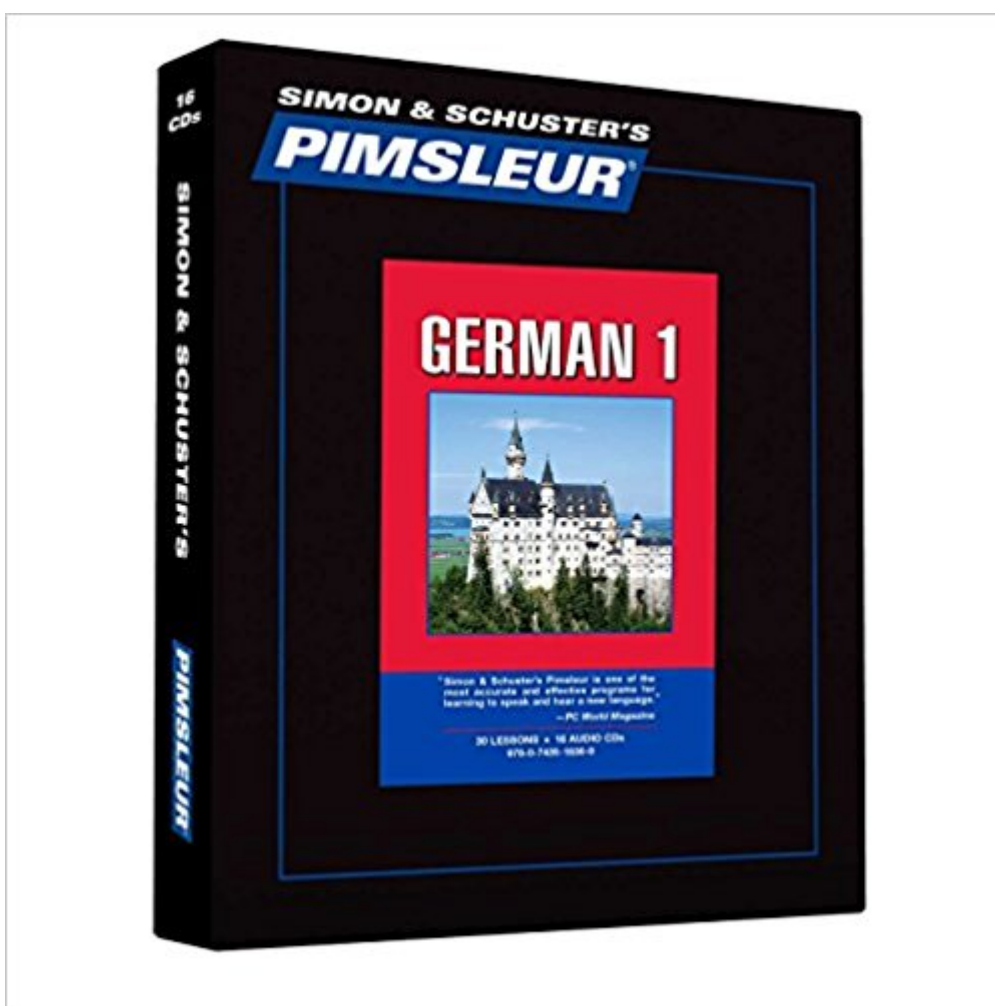

Dr. Paul Pimsleur devoted his life to language teaching and testing and was one of the world's leading experts in applied linguistics. After years of experience and research, Dr. Pimsleur developed The Pimsleur Method based on two key principles: the Principle of Anticipation and a scientific principle of memory training that he called "Graduated Interval Recall." This Method has been applied to the many levels and languages of the Pimsleur Programs.

Absolutely the best language program on the market and I have tried them all. Pimsleur provides clear, distinct, native speakers using words and phrases that you will most likely encounter and need as tourist or a long term visitor to German speaking countries. Speakers start out speaking slowly and clearly to facilitate learning. As lessons progress, they pick up the pace slowly. The CDs are progressive and lessons build upon each other. Download the CDs to your MP3 player, computer or mobile phone and take the lessons anywhere you go. You are not tied to your computer and this version of Pimsleur does not require an internet connection. As with Rosetta Stone, there is no more guessing about pictures that depict useless phrases, such as the "red hat is bigger than the green hat". Learn how to greet people, order in a restaurant, get directions, tell time, purchase goods and so many other useful topics. And it is much cheaper than Rosetta Stone. I feel so much more confident when speaking German now.

I sing in a choir and found our Christmas repertoire will be entirely in German. I know nothing of the language, but thought this might be a good excuse to start learning. I've used Pimsleur before for Spanish, so I got the German version and use it during my commutes. Pimsleur is the best method I know for getting a foundation in a new language. The only way to really learn a living language is to hear and speak it. There are two common complaints about Pimsleur, that it moves too slow and that it uses a narrow vocabulary. I find however that the slow pace and repetition is essential for developing one's ear for the language and for learning essential forms. The narrow vocabulary lets one concentrate on these basics. Another method might cover more ground, but that is useless without assimilation. With Pimsleur, the basics are driven into your brain, and you don't forget

them. When I used Pimsleur to learn Spanish I found that I avoided many of the typical Americanisms such as not distinguishing 'ser' and 'estar' or the inability to use the subjunctive that plagued other English speakers who learned from books. I had a better accent and ear for the language as well. I'm fluent in Spanish now, and I think it is because of the two months I spent with Pimsleur 1 and 2. By contrast I had learned Italian in a classroom setting. It took me years to feel confident in that language, and I never learned it as well as Spanish, despite four years living in Italy! I'm very happy with the German so far. Two recommendations: 1) the CDs are expensive. I bought used, and thought the price was very reasonable. 2) With Spanish, I never used the booklet. It isn't necessary for learning to speak the language, but helpful if you want to be able to read it. I was able to speak Spanish for a year before I became functionally literate in it. I hope not to make the same mistake in German.

I am very impressed with this German I by Pimsleur. The German speech was slow, deliberate and repetitive. Which is exactly what I need. Prior to purchasing this program, I had been studying German for nearly 18 months and could not put a coherent sentence together. The German Grammar being as complicated as it is. I discovered that German Grammar is very complicated because they have so many exceptions. So, again for me this program is ideal. No worries about grammar, sentence structure, only learning to speak the language. I strongly recommend this program to any beginner or intermediate student. Going this way is so much better and less costly than any of the Internet Language Learning Courses since you do not have to rely on cumbersome and inaccurate Internet translators. When I bought this I understood that this was primarily an audio teaching course and other buyers made that quite clear. I have purchased some other courses and this came highly recommended by most people. On the positive side, the breakdown of words and sentences, along with the pronunciation is helpful, but because there is no printed material for this course, you have no idea of what the words look like and it's often unclear (at least in the beginning) how the words are broken up in a sentence. If there was something to look at, like the sentences you're trying to learn, it would be a lot more helpful. I bought a German/English dictionary so I could look up as many words as possible to see what I'm saying. This is time consuming and not really conducive to learning the language quickly. For some people this way of teaching might work, but for me, I probably would have passed on this course if I'd experienced its shortcomings beforehand. A printed transcript of each lesson would make this work so much better. I hope they take this into

consideration. I won't be buying anymore of this course.

Worked though it on drive time to & from work. Enjoy knowing the basics of another language. I found that I was curious about how to spell what I was saying & put in extra time on the computer to learn more. I moved onto German II & plan to keep going with it. Ich sprechen Deutsche, but I am no good at writing it. Since I will only use it as a tourist, writing is not my prime objective. I learned many basics in 2 months and now have been at it for a year. Still enjoying it as I am almost done with German II.

I am disappointed with this product for two reasons. One, half of the CDs I already own as I had previously purchased "Conversational German". This makes me feel ripped off. For those people who purchase Conversational German, there should be an option to purchase the second half of the program. Second, the box containing the CDs doesn't even come close to being as nice as the zip-up case with the cheaper starter set (Conversational German). I had a really hard time getting the CDs out of the plastic holders and was afraid I'd break them in the process. However, this is a great program. After only a few weeks of listening to Lessons 1-16, I went to Germany and was able to understand and speak more than I expected. This made me thirsty for more, which is why I ordered this set (German 1). It's exciting to be able to learn a new language at the age of 52!

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
