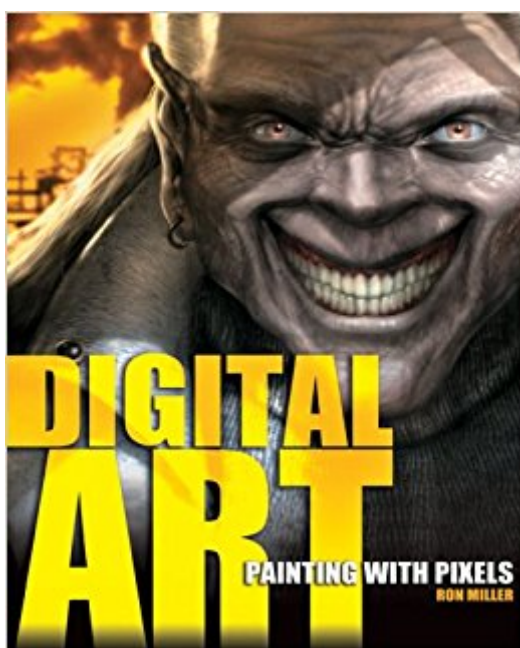

Miller covers the history, background, practice, and future of technology in art, focusing on how digital art is made and how it works. The first chapter covers the "archaeology" of the genre, including harmonographs, oscillons and electronic abstractions, and fractals. By extension, the author also draws parallels between math and art and manages to make the mathematical genesis of the technique fascinating and easily accessible. This chapter also looks at the contributions to the development of computer-generated art of such artists as Robert Rauschenberg and Andy Warhol. Succeeding sections discuss the "hows" of various methods such as computer-aided drawing, animation, 3-D modeling, and motion-picture special effects. The final chapter looks at career possibilities. This beautifully designed book will be an excellent background
